The first time I visited an ear doctor, he did an ABR exam, he immediately told me, "She is a candidate for a cochlear implant," and this was new, obviously, for me. They told me we had two simple choices which was either going the route of being nonverbal and

going through sign language, or hearing and spoken language and receiving the technology.

Genesis' Mother: I was so fearful, and I wanted a miracle. I was just letting

more time go by and canceling the surgery, from the point of being ten months to almost turning three. So many surgeries being canceled. When I finally did decide to go through the surgery was because I realized that my idea of a miracle is not the only idea of a miracle. The miracle was having the surgery. And now you can't get her to stop talking. She's just talking and talking and talking and she has opinions, and

she's been doing really well ever since.

Genesis: Over here, I have my painting, Northern Lights, and these

are the forests. I learned this kind of painting from my teacher. She told me to get three colors, get a canvas, and spread it all over it. It just drips down and it's already art. It's really cool because even though it's messy, it still looks



good. I like doing art because you get to express your feelings on it. Or sometimes you just want to do it for fun.

Genesis: I like reading because you're in a whole different world when

you read. It's like you get to be somebody else but you know who you are, you know? I like to go to the library because like, if you're looking for a book that you really want to read, you get to go through the pages and see if you want that book or not. And when you finish it, sometimes I wish I could
